Education and Outreach

The varied education programme at Norwich Puppet Theatre offers a selection of events and activities to encourage engagement with puppetry from entry level through to professional.

This season, in addition to our regular programme of children's workshops and professional development opportunities, we have a new range of events for Early Years. We are also pleased to announce that we have become an Arts Award supporter and will soon have Arts Award accredited courses available for 11–18 year olds.

Little Tots

As part of our provision for Early Years audiences and parents/ carers, we are launching a new series of play focused workshops alongside our regular **Pre-Schooler Workshops**. Look out for our **Little Tots Workshops** and events throughout the season (see pp. 6–7).

Towers 30 May

A stimulating Little Tots session for ages 0–5 and parents/carers. Come and make giant towers. Build them up and knock them down, then work together to create an enormous masterpiece.

Dough Island 19 June

A fun Little Tots session for ages 0–5 and parents/carers. Enter into the land of dough. Get stuck-in to create an intriguing world of possibilities on the island of dough.

Musical Funniness 6 August

An interactive Little Tots session for ages 0–3 years and parents/ carers. The session will involve voice-play, songs, interactive props, things coming out of baskets and mini-narrative silliness. The session is led by Charlotte Arculus, the founder member and creative director of Theatre of Adventure.

Lights & Boxes 14 August

An inspiring Little Tots session for ages 0–5 and parents/carers. Explore shadow play and light in a cardboard city of giant boxes.

Children's Workshops

Age 5+

We have a packed programme of puppet making workshops aimed at ages 5+. Our workshops give children great creative scope to create a unique puppet character using a wide selection of materials.

All our workshops are given a specific theme so each session focuses on a different type of puppet that has been used in performances at the Theatre, such as rod, glove or marionette puppet.

During the workshop, children will be working on their own with support from our workshop leaders. Adults may either remain in our foyer area or return to collect children at the end of the workshop session. There will be a short break in the workshops for children to have a snack which they can purchase from the Theatre or bring with them.

MagiMation 19

30 & 31 July, 10.30am-3.30pm, Age 10+

Our MagiMation workshops are a fabulous opportunity for budding filmmakers and animators to get creative. Participants will write a script, plan scenes, create characters from modelling material and then animate them, film their movements and record a sound track for their own film.

The workshop leader will then edit all the footage together and send the finished film by email. The resulting films may also appear on the Big Screen at Chapelfield!

Arts Award

Professional Development Summer School

Liz Walker Manipulate and Play

3-4 August, 10am-5pm, Age 16+

The aim of this Masterclass is to explore and develop technique. expression and play by using two person puppets, materials and objects to create short improvisations based on character and movement. The Masterclass will include animating heads and materials, two person 'bunraku' style puppets, half-body-hand-in-head puppets, mass operated puppetry, led improvisations, character and situation development and more. Manipulate and Play is suitable for first-time performers, those with experience of puppetry and anyone with an interest in the art form.

When Objects Come to Life

12-13 August, 10am-5pm, Age 16+

How does a puppet come to life? This practical course for puppeteers, directors, actors and animators shows that an object will appear to be alive if it moves in such a way that we perceive it to have thoughts, feelings and a will of its own. Participants will learn to transmit emotion through the puppet's rhythm, breathing and body language, use precise looks and reactions to show what it is thinking and will discover techniques that can be applied to bring any object life.

Rene Baker has worked in professional puppet theatre for over 20 years. She was puppetry tutor at Central School of Speech & Drama, taught visual theatre at the Institut del Teatre (Barcelona) and has led workshops in festivals all over Europe. She is currently investigating the wider use of objects as symbolic communication.

Making Puppets from Found Materials

15-16 August, 10am-5pm, Age 16+

Making puppets from found materials is about drawing inspiration from the object's intrinsic qualities to create a character. Participants will explore a variety of "stuff" to discover what different materials have to offer and will learn to use form, texture and movement to inform the puppet's character. Everyone will make at least two puppets and in the process will answer essential questions such as: should the material be altered or left as it is? What type of joint will create the right kind of movement? Do I need a control mechanism and where should it be located? The course is suitable for all levels and no previous puppet-building experience is needed.

Summer School Masterclasses are £120 each, £220 for two or £300 for three.

Car parking


The nearest public car park (pay and display) is St Saviours, which is under the Magdalen Street flyover—access from Fishergate or Magdalen Street
